1. What Sildenafil is and what it is used for

Sildenafil belongs to a group of medicines called phosphodiesterase type 5 (PDES) inhibitors. It works by helping to relax the blood vessels in your penis allowing blood to flow into your penis when you get seculally excited. Sidenafil will only help you to get an erection if you are sexuallystimulated. You should nottake Sidenafil if you do notherwe erectile dystunction. You should not take Sidenafil if you are a woman.

Sildenafil is a treatment for men with erectile dysfunction, sometimes known as impotence. This is when a man cannot get, or keep a hard, erect penis suitable for sexual activity.

2. What you need to know before you take Sildenafil

- Do not take Sildenafil

 If you are allergic to sildenafil or any of the other ingredients of this
 medicine (listed in section 6).

You should not use Sildenafil with any other oral or local treatment for erectile dysfunction.

Children and adolescents Sildenafilshould not be given to individuals under the age of 18.

Patients withkidney or liver problems
You should tell your doctor if you have kidney or liver problems. Your doctor
may decide on a lower dosefor you.

Other medicines and Sildenafil
Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking, have recently taken or might take any other medicines.

Sildenafil tablets may interfere with some medicines, especially those used to treat chast pain. In the event of a medical emergency, you should tell any healthcare professional treating-jour condition that youhave taken Sidenafil and when you did. Do not take Sildenafil with other medicines unless your doctor fells youthat you can.

You should not take Sildenafil if you are taking medicines called nitrates, Tou should not used silveream in you are learning inequirens careful microses, as the combination of these products may cause a potentially dangerous decrease in your blood pressure. Always tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking any of these medicines that are often used for

You should not take Sildenafil if you are using any of the drugs known as nitric oxide donors such as army nitrite ("poppers"), as the combination may lead to a potentially dangerousdecrease in your blood pressure.

Some patients who take alpha-blocker therapy for the treatment of high blood pressure or prostate enfangement may experience dicziness or ight-headedness, which may be caused by low blood pressure upon sitting or standing up quickly. Certain patients have experienced these symptoms when taking Sidoneth with alpha-blocker. This simostills killy to occurvithin 4 hours after taking Sidoneth II. In order to reduce the likelihood that these symptoms occur, youshould be on a regular daily doseof your alpha-blocker beforeyou start Sidonatill. Nour doctor may start you on a lower dose (25 mg) of Sidonatill.

Sildenafil with food, drink and alcohol
Sildenafil can be taken with or without food. However, you may find that
Sildenafil takeslonger to start working if you take it with a heavymeal.

Drinking alcohol can temporarily impair your ability to get an erection. To get the maximum benefit from your medicine, you are advised not to drink excessive amounts of alcohol before taking Sildenafil.

Driving and using machines
Sildenafil can cause dizziness and can affect vision, You should be aware of how you react to Sildenafil before you drive or use machinery.

Sildenafil contains tartrazine

3. How to take Sildenafil

Always take this medicine exactly as your doctor has told you. Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

The usual starting dose is 50 mg.

You should not take Sildenafil more than once a day,

You should take Sildenafil about one hour before you plan to have sex. Swallow the tablet whole with a class of water.

If you have the impression that the effect of Sildenafil is too strong or too weak, talk to your doctor or pharmacist.

Sildenafil will only help you to get an erection if you are sexually stimulated. The amount of time Sildenafil takes to work varies from person to person, but it normally takes between half an hour and one hour. You may find that Sildenafil takes longer to work if you take it with a heavy meal.

If Sildenafil does not help you to get an erection, or if your erection does not lastiong enough for you to completesexual intercourse you should tellyour doctor.

If you take more Silderafil than you should: You may experience an increase in side effects and their severity. Doses above 100 mg do not increase the efficacy.

You should not take more tablets than your doctor tells you to.

4. Possible sideeffects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects although not everybody gets them. The side effects reported in association with the use of Sildenafil are usually mild to moderate and of short duration.

If you have chestpains during orafter interce

- Do not use nitrates to treatyour chestpain.
 Contact your doctor immediately.

All medicines including Sildenaft can cause allergic reactions. You should contact your doctor immediately if you experience any of the following symptoms after taking Sildenaft is udden wheeziness, difficulty in breathing or dizziness, swelling of the eyelitis, face, lips or threat.

Prolonged and sometimes painful erections have been reported after taking Sildenafil . If you have an erection which lasts for more than 4 hours, you shouldcontact a doctor immediately.

If you experience a sudden decrease or loss of vision, stop taking Sildenafil and contact your doctor immediately.

A very common side effect (may affect more than 1 in 10 people) is headache.

Common side effects (may affect up to 1 in 10 people) include: facial flushing, indigestion, effects on vision (including colour tinge to vision, light sensitivity, blurred vision or reduced sharpness of vision) stuffy nose and dizziness.

Uncommon side effects (may affect up to 1 in 100 people) include: voniling, skin rash, bleeding at the back of the eye, eye inflation, bloodshotyees refer integrated or paid of the state of touch, vertigo, ringing in the ears, nauses, dry mouth, penile bleeding, presence of blood in semen and/or urine, chest pain and feeling fired.

Rare side effects (may affect up to 1 in 1,000 people) include: high bloor pressure, low blood pressure, fainting, stroke, heart attack, nosebleed suddendecrease or lossof hearingand non-arteriticanterior ischaemicoptic

Additional side effects reported from post-marketing experience include: pounding heartheat, chest pain, sudden death, ortemporary placereasealthood flow to parts of the brain. Mich. conditions.

What Sildenafil looks like and contents of the pack Sildenafil film-coated tablets are blue, circular and biconvex tablets. The tablets are provided in blisterpacks containing 2, 4, 8 or 12 tablets. Not all pack sizes may be marketed.
